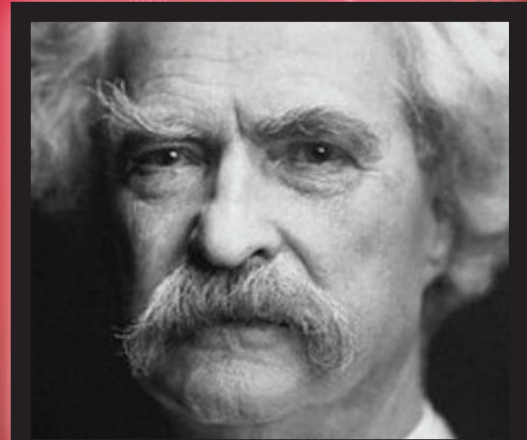


Rebels, Outsiders, and Misfits
