# Collegiate High School Advisory Council Virtual Meeting

May 17, 2017

## Agenda Item: Collegiate High School Update

Applications for the 2017-2018 school year were turned in throughout the month of February. Because the CHS had more applicants than the 75 available spots for the 10<sup>th</sup> grade, a lottery was held on March 9<sup>th</sup>.

## 10<sup>th</sup> Grade

67 collegiate applications submitted - 60 students offered a spot (7 placed on a waiting list)
28 pre-collegiate applications submitted - 15 students offered a spot (13 placed on a waiting list)

We do not yet know how many students, who have been offered a spot, will ultimately accept and attend CHS in the fall. We will continue to take in applications. Orientation for these new  $10^{th}$  graders was held May 2-4.

#### 11th Grade

Thirty-four new juniors have been offered a spot at the Collegiate High School in the fall. They will join our current 75 sophomores in making up the junior class in the fall of 2017. These new juniors went through a Junior Year Orientation (Class of 2019), along with the returning rising juniors, April 10 - 14. After the orientation sessions, returning sophomores conducted their Student-led Conferences with their parents (100% participation) before all rising juniors completed registration for college classes for Fall 2017.

All current CHS juniors (Class of 2018) are participating in Spring Minimester classes. Over the course of 2 weeks (May 8 – May 18), all current juniors take 2 required, 1-week classes (Capstone to College and Financial Literacy: Money Matters) in order to fulfill high school requirements. Each student then choses 6 different mini-classes to take during the interim between the end of college classes and the end of the Collegiate High School calendar year. #### **NWFSC Graduation**

All current sophomores and juniors took the PERT (Postsecondary Education Readiness Test) during the spring, in part, to help measure student academic growth over the school year.

\_\_\_\_\_ % of the sophomores took the Florida Standards Assessments English and Language Arts (FSA ELA) Reading Component test on May 3/4. The End of Course (EOC) exams for Geometry (May 11) and American History (April 27) were also administered.

The Collegiate High School Awards Day will be held the morning of May 23, with graduation later that evening (7:30 in the Mattie Kelly Arts Center).
